Olive Harvest, Sunday May 22nd



The neighbour Henry Kobelinsky, of Graeme Lynas, AG - Goldfields South D980,0 has over 200 olive trees which this year, and he is unable to pick the fruit.

The combined Rotary Clubs of Bendigo South and Bendigo Sandhurst have been invited by Henry to pick the Olives and process into oil. The oil could be sold to members and friends as a fund raiser.

Apulia Olives from Toolleen can process the olives in small batches of 200 kgs each. In past years this will yield approximately 40 litres of oil. The cost for Rotary is \$65.00 per 200kg plus \$3.80 per litre of oil extracted. Bottles (about \$3..00 each) and labels will need to be sourced by the clubs. (I have paid a deposit of \$65.00 to confirm the booking)

Picked Olives are required to be in vented containers of no more than 20kg each and the club will need to provide bulk 20 litre containers for the oil. The oil needs to rest for 6-8 weeks to settle before bottling.

I have made a booking to have 400kgs of olives to be delivered to Toolleen on Tuesday May 24th at 10.00am. (we may be able to do more if we want to)

Both clubs have indicated by a show of hands at their respective meetings that they will have between 10-12 members and friends each to help pick)

This means there will be an Olive picking day on Sunday May 22 at 9.30am.

Where:208 Shanahans Road, Eppalock (through Strathfieldsaye and out past the Axe Creek Church on the Eppalock/Redesdale Road and turn left into Shanahans Road) continue down Shanahans Road for 2.08 kms and turn right into the gateway, (Enright Road turns off to your left about 40m before the gateway)

9.30am start until we have enough.

Bring your own refreshments, water, sandwiches etc. If you have a bucket or similar to pick into, bring it out. All are welcome.
