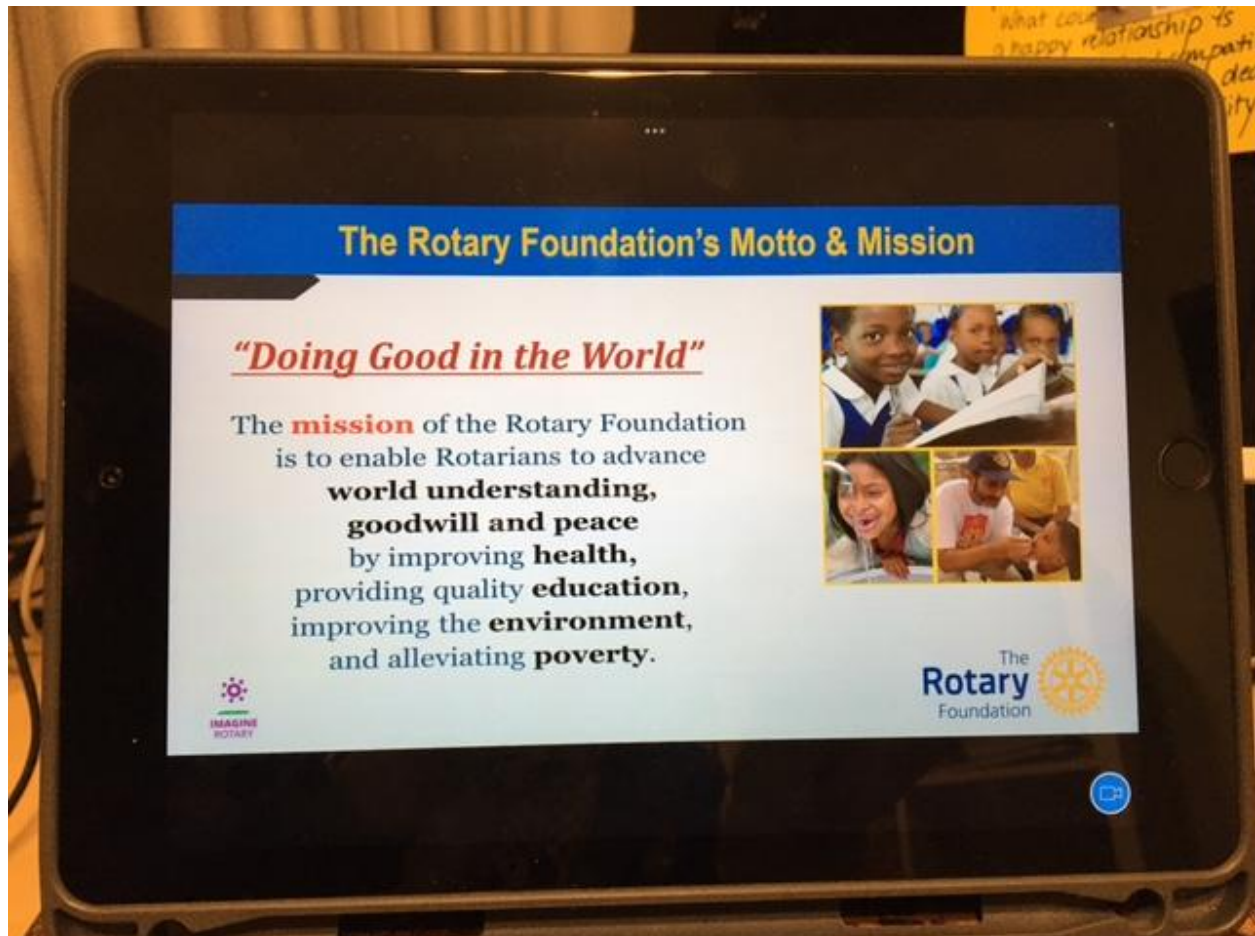
I look forward to Camp Getaway on June 23. There is no Meeting on June 30 as a number of our Members will be attending a Latrobe University celebration.
