# Guest Speaker – Bev Watson – Polio Network Victoria Convenor

I contracted Polio in April, 1956, aged 6-1/2, just two months before the Salk Vaccine was introduced to protect children in this state.

Fairfield Infectious Diseases Hospital, then to Hampton Hospital where I stayed for almost 12 months.

Finally allowed home, I did four (4) years of Correspondence education and returned to my Primary School in Grade 4. This only occurred because my mother fought tooth and nail to have me back in mainstream education and not at a special school.

Five (5) years at Preston Girls Technical College and straight into work at a local new car dealership as Secretary to the Company Secretary.

Married in 1972 and living in the East moved to 7-1/2 acres in Woodend in 1975. 1976 first of my three (3) children was born.

Marriage ended 1989. In 1990 I commenced Tertiary study. 1996 completed my Bachelor of Social Work.

Like so many Polio survivors I now experience the Late Effects of Polio which can make daily activities difficult and tiring but it is not in the nature of a Polio survivor to give in, just make adjustments.
