PRESIDENTS REPORT,

At our last meeting we were at the Foundry where our guest speaker was Gordon McKern OAM. Gordon spoke about the current state of two projects - the extension /re-development of Rotary House in Melbourne which provides accommodation for cancer patients and their families and the Aspire Project in the Sacred Heart Cathedral precinct. Gordon is part of a District working committee on the Rotary House project which will require fundraising and support district wide. Essentially this project is about providing additional and upgraded accommodation. The Aspire Project is well advanced in its planning, has planning permit approval and is still pursuing remaining funding before final schedule of works is finalised. There were many interesting and pertinent questions from members both as a result of the presentation and afterwards in individual discussion. Gordon was also congratulated on receiving his recent Rotary Award presented to him at the Rotary District Conference. This award is for meritorious and exemplary service to Rotary and the Community.

The board at its April meeting resolved the following:

- Welsh Choir concert agreement between City of Greater Bendigo and the club was approved and signed for the concert scheduled on September 22nd and a fourth concert in two years' time.
- Final costs for the Enchanted Flute Concert and Positive Behaviour BJFL will be finalised and presented at the May Board meeting
- . The club is also applying for a District Grant to support the Junior Football project.
- The Club will be purchasing updated software for management of financial records for use by the club Treasurer.

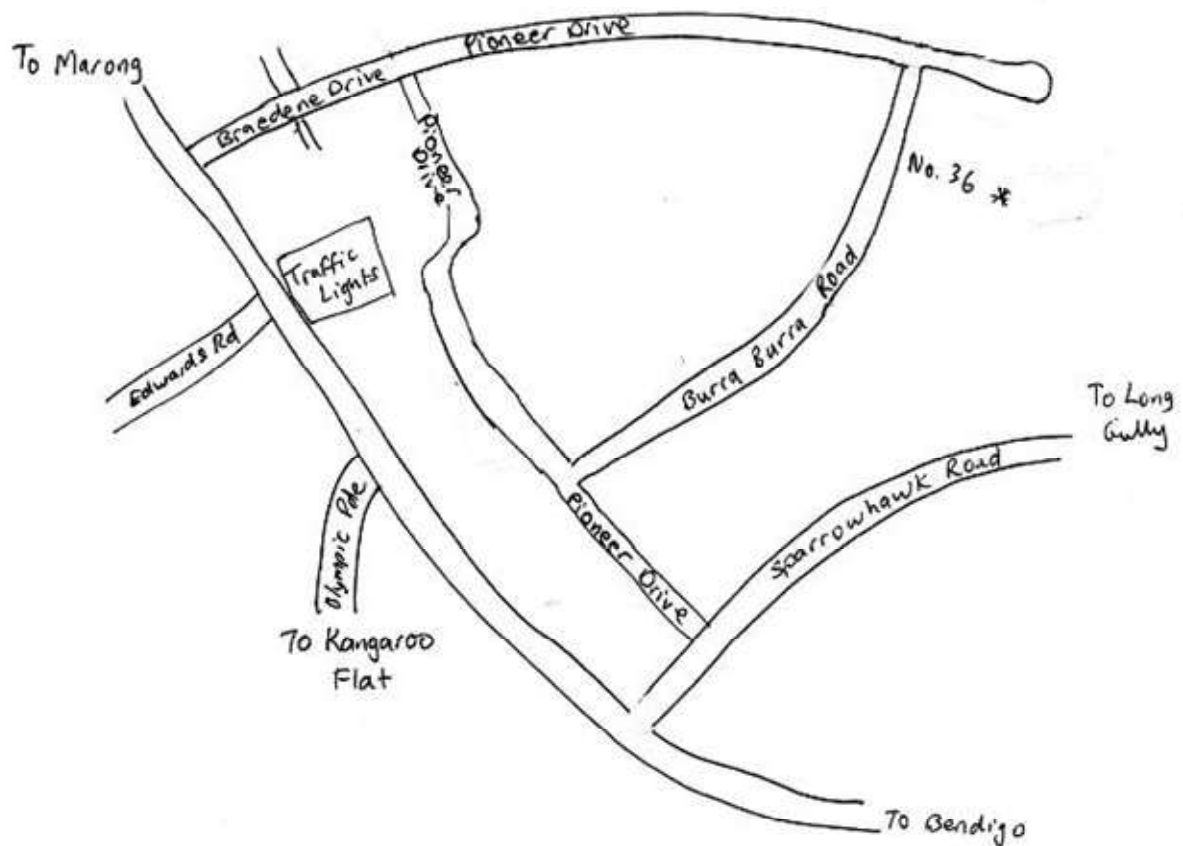

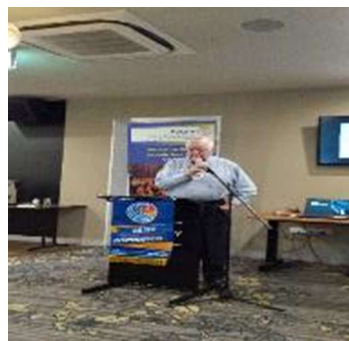
