Sincere condolences to Bernie on the loss of his mother, we are all thinking of you at this difficult time.

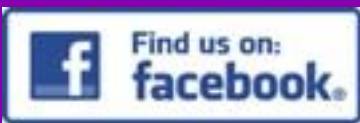
