This meeting will be particularly interesting, with Prue Mansfield - Director of Planning and Development from the City of Greater Bendigo as guest speaker.

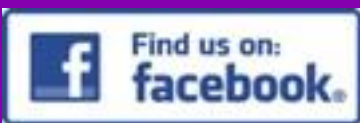
The Rotary Year is nearing completion and changeover planning is underway with District Assembly on May 17th and our handover scheduled for June 25th.
