Ongoing projects include teacher training, art classes and community art activities as well as the education scholarships.

Being Remembrance Day, after we had dined, Heather Nixon gave an informative talk about how Armistice Day became Remembrance Day to embrace all wars that have involved Australian servicemen and women; the bombing of Darwin; the fact there is no War Cemetery in Darwin as the ground is too hard to dig, hence the Cemetery at Adelaide River. Adelaide River was the Headquarters of a large Military Base in WW2 and the Cemetery was created for the burial of servicemen who died in this part of Australia. There is interesting reading to be had by googling Adelaide River War Cemetery. Heather finished her presentation by asking us to join in a minute's silence.

Next week is our AGM. Heather will again be on call to demonstrate our fairly recently purchased defibrillator machine. The following week will be a tour of Langley Hall with the new owners, Thomas and Simone Heywood. Partners are welcome.
