Cael talked us through the process for buildings, vegetation, First Nation sites to eventually be identified and protected by a Heritage Overlay. The initial study is often prompted by applications for demolition. The preservation of history is important, linked with sensitive renovations that preserve the streetscape. Bendigo's wonderful heritage deserves to be protected and celebrated

There are interest-free loans available from the COGB for some aspects of renovation, eg verandas and re-stumping. The Council has produced a brochure 'Pioneers, Poppet-heads and Prosperity' and they have a website – just type in a search for COGB Heritage and it comes up.

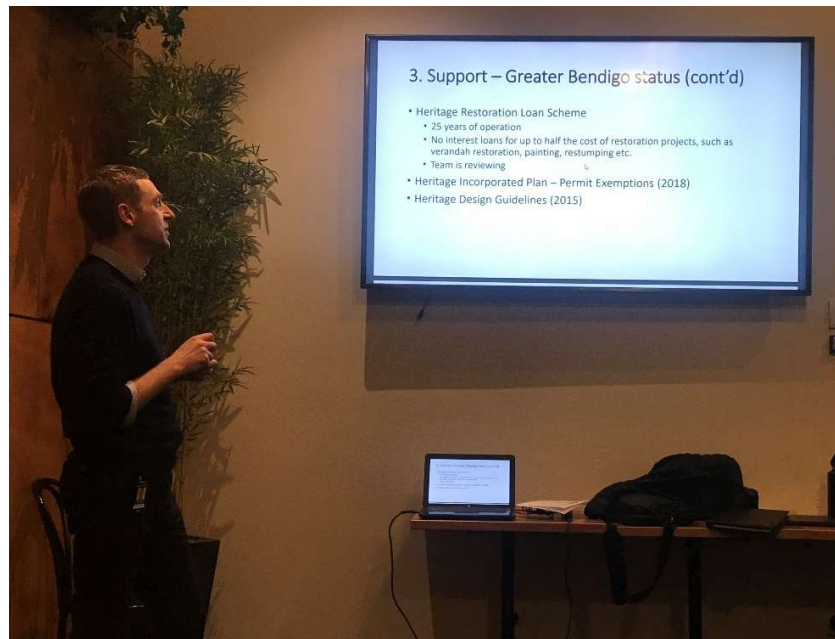
