# Phoenix Australia Centre for Posttraumatic Mental Health – A message from Eliza Blomfield

Thanks for your interest in Phoenix Australia's self-paced online Psychological First Aid and Trauma-informed Care training courses, through which we aim to build community and organisational capabilities across disaster-impacted and high-risk regions in Victoria.

You may be aware that over 1100 frontline workers have now accessed our courses as part of this project for Victorian disaster recovery. As such, there are only about 30 places remaining that we can offer for free, thanks to funding received as part of the Victorian Government's *Mental Health and Wellbeing Bushfire Recovery* package. Ordinarily, these courses are available for a fee of \$308 each.

If there are any members of your organisation who are still interested in accessing our online training for free, we encourage them to log in and claim their place as soon as possible.

Using their voucher code to register is sufficient for them to claim their funded place in the course. Once a person registers, they will still be able to move through the online modules at their own pace until late 2022.

Upon completion, participants will be able to obtain a certificate of completion to share with their manager, organisation or social network, as evidence of continuing professional development.
