PRESIDENT'S REPORT

A busy night was had last Thursday night with most members of the Board able to meet with District Governor Grant Hocking prior to our dinner meeting. Grant learnt the expectations that we have for this year and how we plan to achieve our objectives. During his talk with Club members Grant emphasised the importance of the Rotary Foundation not only for its ability to fund much needed medicines for fighting Polio and Trachoma but also to provide extra funds to support individual club projects whether local or International. Grant also emphasised the need for clubs and individuals to financially support the Foundation so that it can do its work. The "Give me Five" idea is one way individuals can add funds to the Foundation.

Grant talked about the need to attract new members to Rotary including some flexible options like the Passport member who does not need to regularly attend Rotary meetings but is expected to provide 30 hours of time a year to club projects. This is an option which may work for our club. Grant also encouraged members to attend the District Conference in March next year and if possible to assist with tasks like car parking.

I had the pleasure of inducting new member Jan Pagliaro into the Club. Jan will be a great asset to our club and we wish her many happy years working with the club on our various projects and enjoying our social events.

July is the Rotary month for setting the scene and although it may look like not much is happening at the moment there is a lot going in the background. Secretary Tony is putting in considerable effort fine tuning arrangements for the Marina Prior/Welsh Choir concert which will be held on September 22. I have been in discussions with Eaglehawk RC President John Jones regarding our shed plans. The latest is that the Bendigo Council want to develop a Master Plan for the School St block which will delay our project a little. Regular garden and chook shed work is being done at Annie North, Kay is fine tuning arrangements for our new exchange student, planning for the 60th is simmering, some members are assisting with the District Conference planning and I'm sure plenty of other things that of which I am not aware.


