#### **Urgent Food Relief for Cambodians**

The Rotary Club of Bendigo South established the RAWCS Project 'Urgent Food Relief for Cambodians' in August 2020 to support a number of rural villages where people were at risk of starvation due to the economic conditions that they faced with Covid 19. Working with members of the Rotary Club of Phnom Penh since that time and with the wonderful support of communities, we have been able to provide 555 families with 78,000 meals. By working with the Commune chiefs in the various villages, the food being distributed is what Cambodians asked for, rather rather than Rotary telling them what they should, or should not eat. This equates to being able to purchase and distribute 14 tons of rice, 3,300 bottles of soy, 3,300 bottles of fish sauce, 6,600 packets of noodles, 6,600 bottles of soy drinks, 3,300 cans of fish and distribute \$5,500 in cash to villagers to enable them to purchase fresh vegetables, fish and meats.
