Grew up in Bendigo, went to school at Violet St and Bendigo Technical College - built billycarts and raced them down Short St and Rosalind Park. Did paper rounds to pay for my passion – building model aeroplanes – basically a aviation tragic. Went to Melbourne and learnt to fly at Royal Vic Aero Club (2 jobs to pay for it) No flying jobs - flew army Helicopters for 5 years. Moved to PNG in 1975 - flew choppers and twins there for 2 years. Flew 30 pax helicopters around the Whitsundays for 5 years then jets in Australia and Samoa for 5 years. Married a gorgeous flight attendant – we have 3 great kids. Lived in the Middle East for 22 years flying all over the world. Now enjoying helping trainee pilots from RMIT and the ADF start their own exciting careers.

After living/working in 5 countries I have concluded that people everywhere have the same wants and needs – safety, security, and success for their families.

Special mention and praise must also go out to our local musicians who really stepped up to the challenge under the wonderful direction of their conductor Ms. Cally Bartlett. Also must also offer congratulations to our President Merlyn who very professionally took on the role as the concert MC.

How much of a financial dividend at this stage we can only speculate until all expenses are paid. There will be a three way split of the nett gain between The Bendigo Brass Band, The Ulumburra Foundation and The Rotary Club of Bendigo South Inc.

This is the fourth Concert we have now conducted -all being very successful. As I mentioned in some recent correspondence during this month next year we have rescheduled the event we had planned for 2021 featuring the Victorian Male Welsh Choir and Merlyn Quaife. Combined Rotary Clubs of Bendigo National Swap Meet Catering Once a year all the Rotary Clubs in Bendigo work together providing the catering for the National Swap Meet at the Bendigo Showgrounds. This year 11th -13th Nov 2022.

The Rotary Clubs provide 5 BBQ sites plus 4 pie sites; pasty sites, soft drinks, water, milk and ice around the Showgrounds. In the Bendigo Exhibition Centre there is a cafeteria that provides evening meals on Friday & Saturday as well as cooked breakfast on Saturday & Saturday. Also along with FJ's café they provide sandwiches, pies, cakes and barista coffee.

It is a very busy weekend requiring lots of Rotarians to volunteer their time over the weekend. Because of the amount of work required we also ask for volunteer groups to help us. The profits from all the catering is divided between the 5 Rotary Clubs, the 7 Recipient groups and the Car Club. The Rotary Club of Bendigo receives 1/13th of the profit which goes into our fundraising pot. The profit is very dependent on the volume of patrons visiting the National Swap Meet and the weather!

This year our Recipient Groups are CFA Junortoun, Bendigo Lacrosse Club, Y Service Club Eaglehawk-Men and Women, Golden Square Football & Netball Club, Bendigo Brass Band, Bendigo District Scouts and Zonta. Each will receive 1/13th of the profits generated this year.

A Roster will be coming around soon, shifts are 4hours long and we start very early, please volunteer! Although it is hard work, it can be great fun meeting lots of other Rotarians and people from all walks of life. You also get to look around the Swap Meet after your shift.
