Report from Tony Plant - A Blue Tree-Youth Suicide Awareness







Recently I was asked by a friend who is part of a small group associated with supporting youth suicide awareness as to whether I could approach Eaglehawk Hire about obtaining a cherry picker

at Mates Rates. Happens a friend and neighbour is an owner of the business so the deal was arranged.

When I was originally told that someone wanted to paint a tree blue on the banks of Lake Neanger, I was somewhat puzzled. I was to learn this idea originated in Western Australia when a young man as a memorial to a friend he had lost as a result of suicide decided to paint a tree blue to draw attention to the need to recognise that we all need to be aware and better ensure those around us who could be at risk are being supported.

Eaglehawk now has a blue tree and the COGB will soon erect a special seat with a plaque close by.

Special thanks to Eaglehawk Hire for donating the hire free of charge. Did cost me two feeds of Redfin! Also, congratulations to Shane from TAFE for carrying out the work and Rod Flavell for getting it altogether. The commercial market had quoted \$10k to do this work! Certainly, we came in well under budget.

As a Rotarian it was one of those little projects that I initially knew nothing about but was happy to assist in a very small way. If that blue tree just reminds one person to ask a mate at risk are they OK and suggests they seek help and it saves another tragedy then the effort has been worthwhile.
