Volunteers required for laundry pick-up and delivery for the month of JULY.

Starting Friday July 4<sup>th</sup> July Friday 18<sup>th</sup>

Volunteers can be for individual days or both days in the week.

# **Laundry Transfer Operating Rhythm:**

Every Tuesdays and Friday (July only), Rotary Volunteer to do the following activities:

- 1. Drive to Koolamurt Scout Camp to drop-off cleaned laundry (from the previous laundry run\*) and pick up dirty laundry
- 2. Drive to Bendigo Dry Cleaners to drop off dirty laundry and pick-up cleaned laundry
- 3. Keep cleaned laundry (a few days) until ready to do the next drive to Koolamurt (repeating above steps)

# Pick-up / Drop-off Locations & Times

- -Pick-up / Drop-off Locations at the Koolamurt Scout Camp are both in same place behind main hall / dining / kitchen near the BBQ area (also adjacent to laundry area). Laundry will be in large bag(s)
- -Laundry Drop-off / Pick-up time at Koolamurt can be anytime between 7:30am and 5pm. Note: BWNS Morning Shift finish about 8:15am. Evening Shift start about 5:15pm.

Early on Thursday morning June 5th, 72 large bags of knitted clothing items ultimately bound for Timor Leste, were taken from John and Barbara Cannon's storage shed in Kangaroo Flat across to Quality Wool in East Bendigo.

They were packed into 6 large wool bales. From there, the bales were then taken directly to the Donations In Kind warehouse in West Footscray for shipment later this year. Tony and Gary contributed from our club, as well as 2 or 3 members each from Bendigo Sandhurst and Bendigo Rotary clubs. It's an excellent, long-running program, and our clubs all really enjoy the opportunity to get together regularly to support it.
