Incoming President's Report

Last week we had the pleasure of welcoming Graham Neivandt back after caring for Barbara. We also welcomed visiting Rotarian Annette Devereaux, Ron's daughter from the Rotary Club of Geelong East. Her classification is Financial Services.

I outlined the incoming Board's draft work plan for 2025-26. It was developed through two iterations with the incoming Board following a planning meeting on 10 May. It needs to be ratified at the first meeting of the Board on 3 July. One of the needs that I emphasised was the need to increase Members' knowledge and understanding of Rotary. Sue will develop a fortnightly roster of Members to give 5-minute presentations on various aspects of Rotary. Another need is the necessity to get out there in the community, in addition to our BBQ activity. I want to encourage the development of a community project that stimulates significant Member enthusiasm and involves potential new members. Rod will continue seeking out and developing partnerships with LaTrobe University and Bendigo TAFE, as well as with other organisations, such as Hazeldenes. Tony will take on the challenge of developing a greater and more effective use of the media (print and electronic) to show all that our Club is achieving. We regularly need to re-assess our governance systems (Club protection, records and photo management, Club operating procedures) and particularly need to look at our approaches to risk management. Copies of the full draft work plan were distributed at the meeting. Once approved, the work plan will be circulated to all Members.

Some comments on meeting arrangements:

I am seeking your help when it comes to recording aspects of our meeting for the Signpost; this has been falling solely on the President, who should be following the meeting without the diversion of taking notes. Sue will be looking for four Members to go on a weekly roster to provide notes on the speaker to Shireen for the Signpost. At the same time, I ask that any Member who gives a report or 'advertisement' provide notes on this to Shireen as well. We will trial a minor change to the flow of meetings by providing fifteen minutes at the start for Club and

Rotary matters, to be followed by thirty minutes for the speaker and questions, prior to meal delivery at 7:15pm. We need to restrict speaker presentations to twenty minutes.

Sue is seeking a Member to take on Speaker co-ordination; that is, to identify possible speakers for Sue to work into our speaker program and to follow up, if necessary. This should not be daunting. It means checking other Club bulletins on their speaker use, following news items in local media such as the Bendigo Advertiser, soliciting ideas from Members, and using your awareness of what is happening in the broader community. If we do not get a speaker for a particular night, that will not be 'the end of the world'.

A reminder: our Board needs to know your preferences for Committee involvement now. We want to firm up the Committees at our first meeting.

Laundry Transfer Operating Rhythm:

Every Tuesdays and Friday (July only), Rotary Volunteer to do the following activities:

- 1. Drive to Koolamurt Scout Camp to drop-off cleaned laundry (from the previous laundry run*) and pick up dirty laundry
- 2. Drive to Bendigo Dry Cleaners to drop off dirty laundry and pick-up cleaned laundry
- 3. Keep cleaned laundry (a few days) until ready to do the next drive to Koolamurt (repeating above steps)

Pick-up / Drop-off Locations & Times

- -Pick-up / Drop-off Locations at the Koolamurt Scout Camp are both in same place behind main hall / dining / kitchen near the BBQ area (also adjacent to laundry area). Laundry will be in large bag(s)
- -Laundry Drop-off / Pick-up time at Koolamurt can be anytime between 7:30am and 5pm. Note: BWNS staff will be around up to about 8:15am (morning shift) and after 5:15pm (evening shift).
