#### **Horizons Committee explained**

Establishment of a Horizons Committee is not a standard Rotary practice. It is a concept used in various forms by some District clubs. The Club Board approved the current Horizons Committee policy in November 2018, adapting the model that the Club had used for a number of years prior. The policy can be found with other important guideline documents on the member tab of the club website.

The Board appoints a Horizons Committee each year in July as a standing committee of the club. The duties are to:

- Make recommendations to the Board on succession planning for club President (primary function)
- Review major project proposals referred by the Board
- Monitor annual and longer term club strategic planning, and performance, and provide feedback to the Board where required
- Provide advice and support on matters referred by the Board

- President
- President Elect

Two non-Board members – on of whom is appointed Chair

The Horizons Committee must meet at least twice during the Rotary year, and record the minutes of its meetings. The outcomes are reported to the Board, but confidentiality is maintained where appropriate.

# REQUEST FOR VOLUNTEERS – Donation in Kind Volunteers Needed – Join Us at DIK!

DIK is currently in urgent need of extra volunteer support to help deliver on several important projects. If you, your members, or friends can spare some time, we'd love to welcome you. The four key areas where we need a helping hand are:

# 1. Clothing Sorting

We've received a significant donation of new clothing. Volunteers are needed to unpack items, remove packaging and tags, and separate branded from unbranded garments. Unbranded items will support local community programs, while branded clothing is sent to developing countries.

# 2. Packing School Backpacks

We fill school backpacks with essentials like a child's T-shirt, notebook, pencils, a tote bag, and any other available items. These packs are then placed inside school desks and chairs, ready for shipment to schools in need.

# 3. First Aid Kit Assembly

We have many empty first aid boxes waiting to be filled. Once packed, these kits will be distributed to sporting clubs, remote Australian communities, and clinics in developing nations.

# 4. Birthing Kit Preparation

Thanks to our new partnership with Soap Aid, we now have most of what we need to assemble birthing kits. While our supply of kidney dishes is limited, we're packing as many kits as possible while we can.
