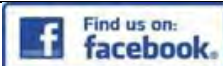

Information about next week's guest speaker: Nigel Preston (Education Team Leader, Energy Breakthrough)

Nigel Preston is a self-confessed 'EB Tragic'. After 'catching the bug' from his older brother, he helped launch the Energy Breakthrough program at Eaglehawk SC with his dad and some mates way back in 1998. Having participated in the EB for four years he finished his VCE in 2001 and volunteering to help with the event management straight away. He's been helping out ever since.

Nigel is also the recently elected President of Athletics Bendigo, Run Director for the Bendigo Ford Fun Run and is passionate about seeing people of all ages and ages be active and participate in their community in ways that work for them.

Bicycle distribution in Phnom Penh supported by our donation through our RAWCS project, "Developing Schools Organisation, Phnom Penh - Cambodia"

Part of the AUD1,144.76 (USD713.41) donated by our Club through the RAWCS project has been used to provide seven bicycles and helmets (USD350) through the Mother's Heart Organization, Phnom Penh for women in vulnerable situations. The remainder of the funds has been allocated to library book projects. We are still to be advised on this expenditure. Thanks to Lyn for managing the foreign coin collection project which provided AUD1,119.83 of these funds in 2024.
