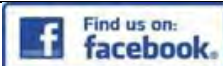

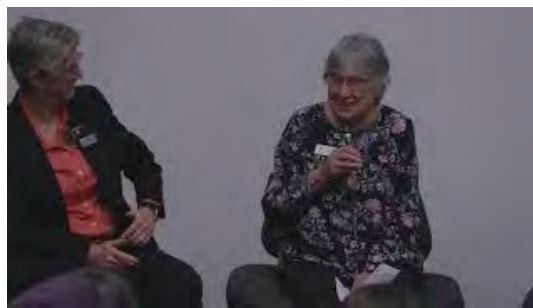

The Members who attended the meeting last week and witnessed the presentation by Nigel Preston would agree with me that there was so much more to Energy Breakthrough than we all thought we knew. Having attended the event for one day last year for the first time along with Rod, Glenn, and Maureen we did experience firsthand a little bit of what the whole event is all about.

We participated in judging the presentations of several primary school teams where they were required to demonstrate to us that they could articulate their planning processes leading up to driving their vehicle at the Energy Breakthrough event. In most cases these group presentations were of a very high standard and most entertaining. We judges worked in teams of three where we individually completed a score sheet assessing several criteria. We then discussed our results and came up with a collective score for each of the criteria.

I do intend to assist in this area once again and the date is **Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> November**. It is a full day **leaving Bendigo around 7.30 am and returning around 5.30pm**.
