Lindsay's notes

Last week we met at the Reservoir Hotel (The Rezzie), Kennington to learn much about organ donations. Danielle Dobie, Nurse Donation Specialist at Bendigo Health outlined the sobering statistics on the shortage of eligible donors, as well as indicating the difficulties that are often involved for families. She was well supported by Richard Betteridge and his wife Julie. Richard had a liver transplant five years ago. Even though there are quite a few issues and side effects from the anti-rejection drugs post the transplant, he is positive about it giving him a life to spend with his family. Danielle emphasised the need to make sure that you are a registered donor. The registration is shown on only one State's licence, South Australia. It was removed from all others. Danielle is available to speak to other Rotary Clubs about organ donation. The funds raised by the Rotary Mandurang Christmas Market will go towards the purchase (\$6,500) and installation (\$500) of a designated patient transport monitor for the organ donation unit at Bendigo Health. The State Government does not fund these units.

I preceded Danielle and Richard's talks with the presentation of a well-deserved Paul Harris Fellow (PHF) to Past President Ruth O'Connell. Rotary International recognised Ruth with the PHF for her donation of over USD1,000 to the Rotary Foundation. She continued her regular donations after she left our Club a few years ago. We thank Ruth for her significant financial contribution over the years.

It was good to hear from Gary that since June our six BBQs have brought in over \$20,000 for community use. Thanks to Gary for his great effort in organising our BBQ program and for the Members in their BBQ work.

It has been a busy time over the past week with Members working at the Rotary Mandurang Christmas Market and at our major CFMEU BBQ. Thanks to Lyn for helping co-ordinate the market with the Rotary Club of Bendigo. On the day, we were fortunate that most of the rain stayed away.

Our sponsored RYLArian candidate, Eric Chu - dentistry student at LaTrobe University - spent his week at the Camp Getaway RYLA Camp. At Thursday night's RYLA dinner, Eric told Jan that he found the week life changing

Raffle Books Reminder


Please Note: This coming week is the last meeting to return raffle books and cash to Trevor.
