Special Rotary pre-screening at The Bendigo Cinemas on Tuesday 6th December 2022 at 5:30pm

For many years, the **Polio Movie Event** has been a very popular way for clubs to *raise funds for Rotary's number one priority, Ending Polio*. It's also an opportunity for Rotary members and people in our communities to have some fun together. This year's movie is *The Lost King*, the story of the rediscovery, by an amateur historian, of the five centuries old remains of Richard III... in a Leicester carpark. Critics describe it as "an incredible and inspiring true story about perseverance and not taking no for an answer".

The movie will be released to the Australia and New Zealand public on Boxing Day, but the great news is that *a pre-release of the movie is available for Rotary.*

To obtain the special discount of \$10 per ticket from the cinema, we are required to guarantee a minimum attendance of 50 people. As all Rotary Clubs in the Goldfields Clusters are being invited to attend the event, I believe we should get the numbers required.


Natalia Update.
