Last week's speaker was Ivan Honey the founder of the youth mental health project called GET HAPPIER project. It aims to equip kids with the tools for a Happier, Healthier life. Available in a range of formats for both primary and secondary students the program uses dougdragster to follow the Open road as opposed to the Dead end road. The creator Ivan has worked all over the world as a psychologist and this program is a result of those experiences. He presented a few of the ideas to the club in his presentation and had a great range of resources on display.

The dragsters teach children to learn the skills for metal health by being able to identify their feelings. Ivan introduced the brochure Open Roads and Dead End Roads and asked which road we should be taking. The Project has produced a number of books to assist learning. 1. Happy Parenting, this provides understanding and support for each other. 2. Ready Set Go for young kids. 3. Life is an Adventure G2 and 3. 4. Magic in Life G4 and 5. 5. Magic in Life G4 and 5. 6. Get Happier in Action G6. These books cover the topics of Self Esteem, Self Respect and to be in control of yourself first. Encourages Love and Belonging, feel significant and feel success. They impress the need for success and to feel freedom of choice in our lives...and to have Fun. They encourage people to take responsibility for their own lives. The Q&A session was lively and members enjoyed the session.


