We had a fun night at Eaglehawk Rotary Club Trivia Youth Program Fundraiser last Friday evening with 28 members and friends attending making up 3 tables. Congratulations to Eaglehawk Rotary Club on a very successful event. Also thank you to Tony and members and friends for their contributions to what was a very enjoyable evening. In supporting another Club's Project work, we are contributing and practicing the Four Way Test.

At this Thursday's Meeting we are hosting a full interclub visit from Bendigo Strathdale where it is the MEC Footy night fundraiser at the Foundry. Please wear your footy colours and be prepared to eat footy food provided by enthusiastic staff at the foundry in Bob's area and the courtyard. There will be two Guest Speakers Greg Penno - President of the Rotary Club of Bendigo Strathdale and Natalie Korinsky from ReLink who will update us as to what has progressed in the past year since her appointment. We have the results of our member Meal Option Vote - 80% of the Club voted. The preference is Option 1 - Single course at \$25. This consists of two costs - \$22.50 for the meal and \$2.50 towards a Club Administration Levy.

Total Club Membership - 38.

This workshop was extremely productive and thank you to the District for conducting this event. Membership Director Tom and his Committee will be conducting a Club Membership Workshop on the 23rd August as the program for our meeting that night.

At the August Board Meeting it was decided that the Club will assist NSW Drought Relief with the donation of a truck of hay. This will cost \$1440 - 77 bales and is being funded from the Club's Emergency Fund Reserve. This has been actioned.

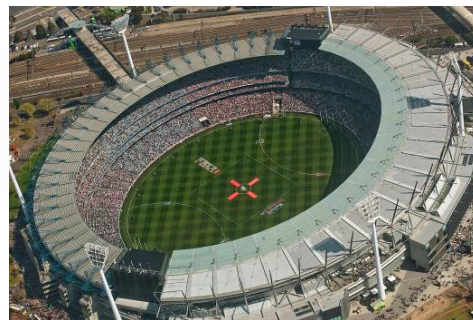
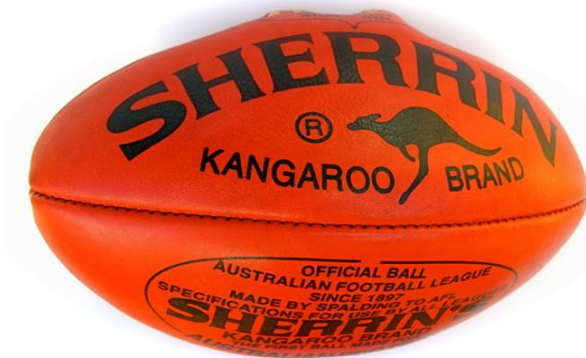
to wear some footy gear and warn anyone who is not suitably attired will be fined.
